

To help support the investments that taxpayers are making in more and better transit options, GoTriangle is forming a nonprofit that will allow individuals, businesses, institutions and philanthropic organizations to contribute to the important work of connecting people and places in the Triangle.

Through July 10, GoTriangle is soliciting proposals from qualified firms to assist with establishing and managing the nonprofit, which will be eligible to receive tax-deductible donations of real property, money and other personal property to support transit-related projects.

The nonprofit will work alongside the Funding and Community Collaborative, a group of more than 20 private citizens and leaders from universities, health care institutions, the private sector and local governments committed to securing additional resources for transit projects.

The people of the Triangle have consistently demonstrated a willingness to make robust investments in their communities. With more residents arriving daily, the nonprofit will help Wake, Durham and Orange counties achieve the goals of their transit plans, including expanded bus service and major new projects like light rail, commuter rail and bus rapid transit.
