Project Architect

Position opening: Durham, NC.

The Project Architect acts as the primary technical point of contact for the architectural planning, design and project development required to implement the Durham-Orange Light Rail Transit (D-O LRT) Project. Directs and coordinates the architectural planning, design and related services for the Project. Duties include oversight and coordination of consultants, contractors, and other professional and technical services firms.

Responsibilities Include (but not limited to):

- Providing architectural planning, design, and construction related expertise for the delivery of the operations, maintenance and parking facilities, stations and related system-wide elements of the D-O LRT Project and potential future transit projects.
- Coordinating the design, integration and implementation of the visual and aesthetic treatments program, signage and wayfinding system and related project elements.
- Coordinating the development of the architectural elements of the D-O LRT Project with institutions, federal, state, and local governments and others with jurisdiction over areas which will be impacted by the Project.
- Overseeing the planning, design, and integration and the preparation of contract documents and specifications for the architectural elements of the Project.
- Managing consultant and contractor activities related to the architectural specifications, drawings, design, procurement and award of D-O LRT Project contracts.
- Coordinating and conducting the development, review and approval of architectural drawings, specifications and other construction related documents which are being developed by the D-O LRT Project Team including the General Engineering Consultant (GEC), Program Management Consultant (PMC) and the Construction Management Consultant (CMC).
- Coordinating across functional lines within GoTriangle, the D-O LRT Project Team, GEC, PMC and CMC, and with external stakeholders, to ensure proper integration of the design and construction of the D-O LRT Project.
- Providing expertise and technical support for the development and update of project schedules, budgets, and cost estimates.
- Coordinating the interface between architectural elements of the D-O LRT Project and the station area planning and development initiatives.
- Participating in the development, coordination and execution of architectural and related plans and certifications associated with transit safety and personal security.

- Assisting in the development of environmental documents and project reporting requirements.
- Making recommendations and presentations to the D-O LRT Architectural Program Manager, Design and Engineering Manager and Project Director on architectural and related matters.
- Working on the development of materials for presentation to the GoTriangle Board of Trustees, other elected and appointed officials and stakeholders, and government agencies.
- Participating in public and community meetings including presentations to professional organizations, business, community, environmental and other interest groups, property owners and tenants and the general public.

The qualified candidate holds a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited four year college or university in Architecture or related design field. A Master's Degree is preferred. The candidate is required to have a license to practice Architecture in the State of North Carolina, with a minimum of ten (10) years of progressively responsible experience in project management including architectural planning, design, cost estimating, scheduling, and implementation of complex public facilities and other large projects preferably in a transit system environment. Professional experience should include project management, architectural design and implementation of complex public facilities. Essential experience includes working with local institutions, government agencies and other entities having jurisdiction over the D-O LRT Project, on the planning and design review, coordination and presentation of architectural plans and related project elements. The candidate should have highly effective verbal, written, analytical, problem-solving, planning and negotiating skills, and an exceptional level of interpersonal skills required to effectively communicate with government officials, staff, and members of the general public. Thorough knowledge, understanding and experience in project development and design, cost estimating, scheduling, and project management of rail transit projects including stations and related project elements is essential. Salary range is \$54,469 - \$101,848 and a comprehensive benefits package is offered.
